DUMP TRUCK REPAIRS

Habitat for Humanity works to build simple, decent, and affordable housing for low to very low-income families. Volunteers and future homeowners work together in the building process. The Huntington chapter currently uses a 2001 dump truck with a hydraulic lift to haul building supplies, gravel, sand, etc. to construction sites. However, the top bed is so deteriorated that the hydraulic lift rod recently went through the bed of the truck, leaving a large hole. Habitat for Humanity is now using an outside vendor to haul materials, which takes away funding from their construction budget. This grant will replace the bed of the truck. FIRE SAFETY IN GREENUP COUNTY

American Red Cross provides shelter, food and health and mental health services to address basic human needs. The core of Red Cross disaster relief is assistance to individuals and families to enable them to resume their normal daily activities. The Eastern Kentucky Chapter wants to safeguard underserved community members Greenup County. They plan to do this by providing home and fire disaster education to children. This grant will provide funds to install smoke alarms free of charge and enable the Red Cross to work with local fire departments to teach residents about fire safety. TRAINING FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATORS AND STAFF

RVCARES will be providing a specialized child care center for babies who have been exposed to substance use in utero. In this model center, observation rooms are available so that child care providers and/or family members can learn how to meet the special needs these children possess. The center will be licensed by West Virginia's Department of Health and Human Resources to act as a training facility for staff from other child care centers. This grant will provide equipment for the trainings they offer, and is funded, in part, by the WV NIP Endowment Fund.

Each summer, Ashland schools provide a free breakfast and lunch to its students at a single location, Crabbe Elementary. Some of the district's high school students are working to solve the transportation problem for many of the district's hungry kids who cannot make it to the central site. They have received a donated truck that now must be retrofitted with food service equipment in order to meet health code. Food and Hygiene Pantry

The Pathfinder Pantry aims to assist students by supplementing their food sources. An ACTC staff member will oversee the daily operations of the pantry; however, ACTC students will staff the pantry, modeling it from a business perspective. Project Lifesaver Program

Project Lifesaver is a program that helps locate a person with a disability (such as Alzheimer, Dementia, Autism, Down Syndrome, etc.) who is missing. Each person has a bracelet with unique six-digit number that can be tracked using the equipment and a team of people. Twelve people are currently enrolled in this program with the goal of adding more. The project will specifically address the need for updated tracking equipment and supply additional bracelets for the program. Without the updated equipment, the program would be unable to continue.

Playground Fencing

The current 4-foot fence around the Fifth Avenue Baptist Nursery and Preschool playground will be upgraded to a 6 foot fence which will keep destruction of new equipment and gardens to a minimum. The fence will help to protect the investment made to turn the playground into an outdoor learning environment for the children, which includes vegetable gardens, a butterfly garden, a riding path, and new equipment to help with physical development. This new fence will address safety concerns such as children being abducted and will help prevent people from sleeping on the playground and leaving trash and needles behind.

Strengthening Families Program

The Strengthening Families Program for Parents and Youth 10-14 is delivered in seven sessions. The scientifically tested curriculum is taught with 7-10 families over seven weeks. Impact Prevention, Inc. has been contacted by three court systems requesting a parent/youth program for families involved in the court systems. This will allow them to acquire certification for agency staff, court staff, faith-based leaders, and others to carry out this program.
